Doctoral Researcher (f/m/d, 30h/week)

You will develop your dissertation project around the subject matter. The position will allow you to

- Analyze processes of identity building and community formation in the virtual world
- Co-design and co-write grant applications
- Engage in advanced scientific research and independent policy advice

- You have strong skills in digital methods (e.g., virtual ethnography, walkthrough method, web scraping, text mining), or a strong interest in developing these skills.
- You are prepared to conduct methodologically demanding qualitative and/or quantitative studies.
- You have excellent written and verbal communication skills in English. Good command of German is an advantage.
